

still be dealt with in a way that is unjust. And my job, no matter how much I dislike the conduct the person is engaging in, no matter how much I dislike the person who is engaging in the conduct, I still want to strive for justice, whether I always reach it or not is another matter. In this instance, we are, though, not just talking about professional and occupational licenses, we are talking about drivers' licenses. So let's say you have a woman who says, I'm not going to let this rat visit his children. And, maybe he is not a rat. Maybe she is a "ratess" or "ratette" and the judge has an attitude toward women, so he says, let him see the kids...

PRESIDENT ROBAK: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...or you are not going to drive any more. And she says, I'm going to drive no matter what you say. So, the judge has revoked her license and she drives. Now she is driving on suspension and you can get six months in jail for driving on a suspended license. Did you all realize that? Six months in jail. And, they will not let you drive your car someplace, they will take you out of your car, they will tow it and you get six months in jail and you pay the storage and the cost of having your car towed for driving on a suspended license. You need to look at the ripple effect of some of these heavy-handed things that on first blush seem so alluring. Madam President, I have talked ten minutes already?

PRESIDENT ROBAK: No, Senator, you have one minute left.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay, well, nine minutes, it didn't even seem that long to me. I will give that minute back and then turn on my light.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Thank you, Senator Chambers. Senator Bernard-Stevens.

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: Thank you, Madam President and members of the body. I rise in support of the Chambers amendment. Probably, Senator Chambers, you and I will be the only people supporting the amendment, but nonetheless, one of the things that Senator Chambers has stated that has bothered me with what we have in the bill right now, and I'll be honest, the entire bill bothers me still and at this point I am still not even supportive of the bill. But when we try to attack an issue that we all deeply have emotional feelings on, and that is trying to
