SENATOR WEHRBEIN: All right.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...would be gone through.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: I have that then. Thank you. You picked and chose, is that the idea, where you struck?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Well, I started on page 8 with Section 37 and will strike all of the sections through 43, because...

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Okay.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...Sections 37 through 43, as a whole,...

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Okay, all right.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...deal with that.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Okay, now I'm with you. Thank you.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Senator Dierks, on the Chambers amendment.

SENATOR DIERKS: Thank you, Mr. Speaker, members of the body. I'm going to support Ernie's amendment. I think that the bill that we're talking about today is more of a Band-Aid approach to a court problem. And I don't think...I think that it's not...not up for us to do this sort of thing. I don't think we should be doing this sort of thing. I don't think we should be doing these Band-Aid things to try to solve a problem that's somebody else's problem. It's a judiciary problem, not a legislative problem. And I think that Ernie is on the right track with this amendment. I think that taking licenses away is a very onerous thing, I think it defeats the purpose of what we're trying to do because you lose the right to do your practice, and you lose the right to drive your car, and you lose the right to make your living and earn the money you need to pay child support. I think he's right on track with it and I'm going to support it and I hope you do, too. Thank you.
