

SENATOR CROSBY: Thank you, Senator Bernard-Stevens. Senator Chambers, did you wish to speak on the bracket motion?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Madam President, I'd like to ask Senator Day a question. Senator Day, I see your light is on.

SENATOR CROSBY: Senator Day.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: How do you feel about this bracket motion?

SENATOR DAY: I do not support the bracket motion.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay. I am going to see how this plays out. See, this...this that you all are doing doesn't involve me. I have decided, I may as well tell all of you like I have been telling certain individuals, there are some things that are going to happen in this Legislature, from which I am just going to remove myself and let all the white senators work out. And this is one of those issues where you all can work this out among yourselves. When you decide what you are going to do with the bill, I'll discuss the bill, but this is white folks' mess, and I am the outsider. I have that made glaringly clear to me and I've said before I can accept whatever the rules are, all I need to do is know what they are. So I am going to let you all tend to your mess, and then when that is taken care of, I'll debate the bill if we continue at this time.

SENATOR CROSBY: Thank you, Senator Chambers. Senator Beutler, on the bracket motion.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Senator Crosby, members of the Legislature, I think the bracket motion is entirely inappropriate. We have made good progress on this bill. We have addressed two or three key points. The Legislature has made a decision on those points. You made a decision that you don't want to go as far with visitation rights as the committee amendments suggested, but you did adopt the Day amendment, which says we want to do something with regard to visitation rights. You rejected Senator Chambers' suggestion that visitation should not include the tool of license revocation. That's been decided, but now, apparently, since two things have been decided contrary to the way Senator Bernard-Stevens would like them decided, I guess we have to bracket it now on the basis, and try to establish this confusion relating to who said what to whom, and the credibility
