SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Yea...well, I don't think they've billed for that much at this point, no.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: No, they haven't.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: These are all estimates you understand.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Now, are you aware that a few weeks ago they reduced that 52 million down to 42 million saying that some of that, that 10 million of that had been discovered independent of Maximus? Were you aware of that?

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: So now how you going to get back up to 52 million?

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Well, we've discussed this in detail. We have cash-flow sheets, projections that are best estimates which has changed about every day...

SENATOR CROSBY: One minute.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: ...for the last sixty days as to what we possibly could get, this is our best estimate. We have also built in some of the money that we thought was going to be Maximus, is now coming already direct under...outside the Maximus contract. That also will be explained in the budget when we bring it to you.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: So how do you know the difference between what Maximus brings in and what somebody else does?

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Well, it's difficult exactly to pin that down, and that's why we have to keep on top of it every day and that's what we're doing. You don't know exactly but we're...obviously we're not going to take any money through Maximus and pay a commission on it if we think that it was properly discovered, if I may use that word, otherwise.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And my time is about out, so I'll turn on my light. Thank you.

SENATOR CROSBY: Thank you, Senator Chambers. For further
