They had to hire a consultant out there to tell them the whole operation is going to hell in a handbasket and that's what that consultant told them. They had to hire these consultants that I've already mentioned because nobody in the Health Department knows how to do anything. Nobody in DSS knows how to do anything and there are other agencies that are...they mentioned that the Department of Corrections paid over \$22,000 to hire a consultant to tell them to privatize a laundry operation. They've just got money to throw away. That's how you're streamlining government? That's how the Appropriations Committee is functioning in the role of oversight? Or are they much more comfortable, the Legislature, in creating a committee to review what the Equal Employment Opportunity Commission does, or the Equal Opportunity Commission does? Now they can come in with some very specific things on that. They can get very precise on that because we're talking about people who are discriminated against in employment and that makes you all uncomfortable. But when it talks about nonexistent money, here's the Appropriations Committee doing it. Now you're all going to have an opportunity to rub a lot into my open wounds, a lot.

SENATOR HALL PRESIDING

SENATOR HALL: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...because I'm going to keep on taunting and ridiculing and you have people saying that that contract can't be terminated and the contract itself tells how it can be terminated. If the appropriations are not there, DSS terminates the contract. Now how are you going to have a cause of action for terminating a contract pursuant to the terms of the contract and they tell you all that and you buy it. What we need are some lawyers in this body and I don't mean people who have just finished law school and are licensed through the bar association. I mean some people who understand the law and can think. But right now what is before us is the indefinite postponement of this bill which I think is pork barrel.
