I intend to raise the issue, I intend to fight it and I don't see that the state is going to come to an end if this bill does not pass. You will have saved the state \$700,000.

SENATOR HALL: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Aren't you all in the business of saving money? We are when it comes to poor people. They eat too much anyway seems to be the attitude. But for these agencies which have appetites that can never be satisfied, here's 700,000, there may be a million, over there maybe 1,500,000, small piddling amount is what the attitude is. But when we come to people who have not much of anything, we want them to stretch that dollar till it will reach the width of the room that we stand in here today and that's impossible. I have no sympathy for the executive branch. I am not in agreement with advancing this bill or enacting it into law, so I have no choice other than to resist it and that is what I am doing. I hope enough of you will agree to...
