

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you. Here's what I think Senator Brashear told me after we cut through everything else that he said and that I asked. If we wind up in this situation again and they come in for a deficit appropriation, we will make it because we owe it to the workers. And I still stand by what I said just before asking that last question, we have given them a blueprint. Promise anything you want to, overspend, need the deficit appropriation and the Legislature will feel compelled to give it and they have usurped our appropriation and authorization authority. They have done it.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Thank you, Senator Chambers. Senator Witek.

SENATOR WITEK: Question.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: The question has been called. Do I see five hands? I see five hands. The question before you is, shall debate cease? All those in favor vote aye; all those opposed vote nay. Senator Witek.

SENATOR WITEK: I will ask a call of the house with call-in votes accepted.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: There has been a request for a call of the house. All those in favor vote aye; all those opposed vote nay. Please record.

CLERK: 17 ayes, 0 nays to go under call, Madam President.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: The house is under call. Will senators please return to their seats. Will all unauthorized personnel please leave the floor. The house is under call. Senators, please check in. We are accepting call-in votes.

CLERK: Senator Hartnett voting yes. Senator Janssen voting yes. Senator Warner voting yes. Senator Bromm voting yes.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Please record.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays to cease debate, Madam President.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Debate ceases. The Chair recognizes Senator Chambers to close on his motion.
