

SENATOR BEUTLER: No, sir.

SENATOR JANSSEN: No increases, this is all nonresident.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Right.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Except for the motorboat, that is resident.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Which you are about to eliminate, we hope, by the committee amendment.

SENATOR JANSSEN: All right, thank you.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Thank you, Senator Janssen. Any further discussion on the committee amendments? Senator Beutler, to close on the committee amendments. Closing is waived. The question is the adoption of the committee amendments. All in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. Record.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of the committee amendments.

SPEAKER WITHEM: The committee amendments are adopted. Senator Beutler, to open on your bill.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Senator Withem, members of the Legislature, I did pass out to you a chart that shows what we're doing and what other states are doing. What this chart shows on the second column, the proposed fee under LB 583, you'll see, for example, on the category of nonresident annual small game plus stamp, that we have created a fee range from \$55 to \$72. That's in accordance with what the Legislature directed a couple of years ago when we started putting all of Game and Parks' fees in ranges rather than a set dollar amount so that we didn't have fee bills every year but could oversee it every three or four years as necessary. So in that column, proposed fees under 583, you see the proposed ranges for the four different types of fees that are being increased and you can compare them to the fees in other states which are the fees that are currently in existence in other states and I think you'll see that it puts us in the competitive range. Thank you.
