LB 535, 544

CLERK: LB 535, introduced by Senator Schellpeper. (Read title.) The bill was introduced on January 18, referred to Revenue, advanced to General File. I have no amendments to the bill, Mr. President.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Senator Schellpeper.

SENATOR SCHELLPEPER: Thank you, Mr. Speaker and members, this is a bill that went to the Revenue Committee. It came out without any opposition. It's a bookkeeping bill that will allow the fuel dealers to, when they take fuel to a customer or farmer. Currently they have to put your number on the invoice and this bill would allow them to keep the invoice, or the number at the office. Currently the people that haul the fuel out, a lot of times they don't know the exact number because your numbers change and this way it would allow them to keep it at the office for any audits that the revenue people might have and it's a way to kind of streamline the bookkeeping at our fuel dealers. So it's a very noncontroversial bill. I would move for the adoption. Thank you.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Any discussion? Any closing? Closing is waived. The question is the advancement of LB 535. All in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. Record.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the advancement of 535.

SPEAKER WITHEM: LB 535 advances. LB 544.

CLERK: LB 544, by Senator Beutler. (Read title.) The bill was introduced on January 18, referred to Judiciary, advanced to General File. I have no amendments to the bill.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Senator Beutler, on your bill.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Senator Withem, members of the Legislature, this is a bill that I've worked out with the interested parties over a period of about five years and this year I think absolutely everybody is satisfied and I hope that is reflected by the fact that the Judiciary Committee had no amendments to the bill and it was passed out, of course, without a dissenting vote. A chart is being passed around to you that gives you a perspective on what 544 does. Okay? And I'm going to oversimplify a little bit to give you the general concept and
