SPEAKER WITHEM: Thank you, Senator Beutler. Senator Brashear, for discussion on the advancement of LB 544.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Absolutely.

SENATOR BRASHEAR: Would you just explain briefly, and I'm not that familiar with your legislation and I'm not trying to exhaust the time. An appeal, what is the effect of an appeal of a divorce decree under this bill?

SENATOR BEUTLER: The appeal would have to be taken in 30 days after the entrance of the decree and, of course, if an appeal is filed, it would suspend the finality of the decree as usual.

SENATOR BRASHEAR: Thank you.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Okay.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Thank you, Senator Brashear. Further discussion on the advancement of LB 544? Seeing none, Senator Beutler, closing? Closing is waived. The question is the advancement of LB 544. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. Record.
