

SENATOR WESELY: While he's checking on that, the only...I just hadn't had time to look at the bill but it's very important to me that the Legislature continue to have a role to play to ultimately agree to or disagree with an acceptance of a gift and if that doesn't change and this is a process, that sounds great. Is that correct?

SENATOR LYNCH: Well, currently we have the authority for projects that are involved of \$10,000 or more.

SENATOR WESELY: Right.

SENATOR LYNCH: But that hasn't changed.

SENATOR WESELY: Okay, that's all I wanted to know. Thank you.

SENATOR HALL: Thank you, Senator Wesely. Thank you, Senator Lynch. Senator Pirsch, did you care to speak to the Lynch amendment? No, to the bill, thank you. Is there anyone else who would care to speak to Senator Lynch's amendment? Seeing none, Senator Lynch, to close. Waives closing. The question is the adoption of the Lynch amendment to the committee amendments. All in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of Senator Lynch's amendment.

SENATOR HALL: The Lynch amendment is adopted. Anything else on the committee amendments?

CLERK: Nothing further, Mr. President.

SENATOR HALL: We're back to the committee amendments. The speaking order is as follows. Senator Cudaback, on the committee amendments, no. Thank you. Senator Maurstad, on the committee amendments.

SENATOR MAURSTAD: Yes, Mr. President, and if I could ask...if Senator Robinson could answer a couple questions. He is the committee Chair, right?

SENATOR HALL: Senator Robinson, yes, he is, would you respond, please.
