

SENATOR MAURSTAD: No, and I don't know that they have any opposition. I'm just raising a question as to on the next page it goes on and it talks about the ineligibility for federal funding and then it also talks about, or would result in hardship on any agency, board or commission due to other exceptional or unusual circumstances and I guess I would interpret that to mean that DAS could make a determination as to whether or not they could clean the latrines somewhere or whether or not Game and Parks ought to and I'm just wondering if DAS ought to have that authority to do that or whether there maybe isn't somebody else that could better handle those circumstances.

SENATOR ROBINSON: Well, I don't know who better could do it than DAS because...

SENATOR HALL: One minute.

SENATOR ROBINSON: ...their Building Division, those people would actually be the ones closest to it, as far as I could see, if it were centralized, so...

SENATOR MAURSTAD: Okay, and I appreciate...

SENATOR ROBINSON: I'm sure they could work it out with the Game and Parks if there was a...(inaudible)

SENATOR MAURSTAD: Well, and I want to reiterate, I don't know if there is anything, I don't know if there is anything that needs to be worked out with Game and Parks, I'm just...I have some concerns on my own and with all due respect to those that have signed onto the bill, I will certainly support it with them, but I have some concerns because, as I've gone through the appropriations process, I'm not completely confident that putting more authority within fewer number of agencies is necessarily the direction that we want to go and necessarily indicates that it's the most efficient way. So I have some concerns and I assume that as we continue to discuss this maybe those will be alleviated. So, thank you, Senator Robinson.
