

SENATOR ROBINSON: Okay.

SENATOR WARNER: ...for clarification too.

SENATOR HALL: Senator Robinson.

SENATOR WARNER: You indicated, and I was looking on page 18 at the top of the page, it indicates, and you made the statement that this section does not apply to the university, that's Section 11. I assume, although the statute doesn't say that, that that would apply to state colleges as well?

SENATOR ROBINSON: Right.

SENATOR WARNER: Or is should?

SENATOR ROBINSON: Right, that's correct, sir. We've had that question...

SENATOR WARNER: I suppose at some point that ought to be clarified maybe, at least in the statutes. It's a bit...

SENATOR ROBINSON: Okay.

SENATOR WARNER: And the other provisions, you get to Section 12 and it talks about the state comprehensive capital facilities planning, and I don't know that I have an object...well, I don't object to it, but in your discussion was there recognition that the Coordinating Commission has a designated responsibility at least in postsecondary education in that same area, and I don't know if there is a duplication where we're creating conflicting comprehensive plans. I guess my long-term question is that maybe we should look at that before Select File. If this is a general kind of comprehensive plan, that's one thing, but it would seem to me it could be cumbersome, at best, if we have two different agencies developing comprehensive plans which might end up in conflict.

SENATOR ROBINSON: We'll visit with you between now and Select and come up with something that will clarify that. Is that all right with you?

SENATOR WARNER: Yup.
