SENATOR HALL: One minute.

SENATOR ROBINSON: ...a state architect, it's a licensed architect or engineer.

SENATOR PIRSCH: Who, by name?

SENATOR ROBINSON: Well, it would depend. Forty thousand was chosen as the threshold because of the current statute requires the services of a licensed architect or engineer if the estimated cost of the project exceeds \$40,000.

SENATOR PIRSCH: Oh, yeah, but I wondered where that figure came from, the 40,000 as opposed to the 15,000.

SENATOR ROBINSON: It's in statute.

SENATOR PIRSCH: Fifteen thousand is presently in statute. Your committee raises it to \$40,000 threshold and I wondered what rationale or who recommended that increase, what much of an increase.

SENATOR ROBINSON: The recommendation came from the Building Division.

SENATOR HALL: Time. Thank you, Senator Pirsch. Senator Chambers, your light is next, followed by Matzke, Witek, Avery, Schmitt, Robinson and Jensen. Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. President and members of the Legislature, I would like to ask a question about something that I heard in my office and it brought me up to the floor. Senator "Bud", would you answer this question?

SENATOR HALL: Senator Robinson.

SENATOR ROBINSON: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Was there a comment made with reference to Game and Parks to the effect that some money they get is federal and one of the conditions is that these buildings remain under the control of the Game and Parks Commission, or did I not understand what I was hearing?
