

SENATOR ROBINSON: No, that's what you heard and according to federal law that if the money is federal money, those services would have to be under the State Game and Parks, could not be under the...it could not be part of the bill. It would have to be under that agency.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And if it were placed under DAS...

SENATOR ROBINSON: We would lose that money. We could lose federal funds because of that.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: How do you know that to be the case? And I'm not saying that to be argumentative, on what do you base that conclusion that the federal money would be lost?

SENATOR ROBINSON: We were told by Game and Parks that's what would happen.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay, okay. Then am I to understand that whenever federal money comes to the state, if there are conditions attached, then those conditions must be met or the money would have to go back to the federal government?

SENATOR ROBINSON: Well, yeah, it would have to go back if you didn't use that money the way they told you how it was to be used, yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Let's say that we got this money a few years ago and, so that it's easy for me, it would be \$5 million and it had to go back. Would interest have to be paid on that money for the period of time that the state had it or don't you know?

SENATOR ROBINSON: I can't answer that, Senator. I can find out, but I can't answer that.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: So then, I'd like to ask you another question.

SENATOR ROBINSON: Why would you give the money back?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: No, I'm saying if you didn't comply with the conditions of the grant, then you'd have to give it back, that's what I'm saying.
