SENATOR ROBINSON: Okay, sure, that's correct.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay, and you want to avoid that by allowing these Game and Parks buildings to be exempted.

SENATOR ROBINSON: Right, to be exempt, yeah, to be exempt.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Would the same apply if, say, you all bring some money from Maximus here under various federal grants and you tried to put it in different funds and use it for purposes other than the programs for which that money was intended, when that determination is made, if it is, then that money would have to go back to the federal government just like this money?

SENATOR ROBINSON: I can't answer that.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Well, I thought you said that when federal grants are involved, the money has to be spent in accord with the conditions of the grant. Well, you know...

SENATOR ROBINSON: Well, it depends on the grant, depends what the grant would say.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Are you aware of any...

SENATOR ROBINSON: But the Maximus money would not be grants.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: So then...

SENATOR ROBINSON: Like the Games and Parks, there would be a difference there. In Maximus you're just getting federal money that should have been there earlier if it would have been identified properly by a certain agency.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Well, to identify it properly, doesn't it have to be involved with some program for which the money was intended by the federal government?

SENATOR ROBINSON: That's correct.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And under these programs, are not there conditions that have to be met before the money can be obtained?

SENATOR ROBINSON: That's correct.
