SENATOR ROBINSON: Mr. Speaker and members of the body, Senator Witek talks about that this just doesn't look like the bill that we talked about. Basically, all we did was amend one bill into another bill. Evidently, she must not have been at the same committee hearing I was at, because basically it centered around being efficiency in government. And talking about what Senator Avery was talking about, we're talking about a phase-in to work out any problems that you might have in this area. They're just not going to come in and take over. They're going to work with these agencies. And it surprises me when we talk about efficiencies in government, some of those people that...and I'm one of them, that support efficiencies in government, they stand up and, well, we can't do this, we don't...the centralize is going to hurt us. Well, sometimes centralizing things can mean efficiencies in government because things were talked about in the committee hearing that efficiencies could be brought about. And, as I stated, they're not going to just come in and take over. They're going to phase this program in. Thank you.
