

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Thank you, Senator Cudaback. Senator Hall.

SENATOR HALL: Thank you, Madam President, and members, I have a question about this Games and Parks bill. (Laughter.) The...ha, ha, ha, ha. Senator Chambers, that was for your benefit. I try to carry on the tradition of Senator Labeledz who used to drive you crazy when she always said Games and Park. Senator Lynch, would you respond to a question on page 17 of the committee amendments? And I came back and touched on this with you, and it speaks somewhat to what Senator Cudaback just said and it's just for clarification purposes. As I understood your explanation, and this is the area that deals with any gift, bequest or devise of real property. It defines what those are but then down in subsection (2) we actually have the definition and it says any...it says, for purposes of this section, a gift, bequest or devise shall include but not be limited to, and my concern there is do we need to maybe clarify that a little bit and talk about real property again in that definition so that there is that understanding that it does not affect the cash...a cash gift, as you stated was the intent behind the proposal. And I'm just thinking that maybe as a Select File amendment that we...it reads something along the lines of for purposes of this section, a gift, bequest or devise of real property shall include but not be limited to, so that there is an understanding that by definition we haven't circumvented the intent, and it does not apply to cash donations, as I understood was the purpose behind the bill. Would you be amenable to something along those lines?

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Senator Lynch.

SENATOR LYNCH: Well, with some people I might be curious and concerned; with you, yeah, I'm amenable. (Laughter.)

SENATOR HALL: Okay, I'll have you put those toilets in for right around \$15,000. I just have to have a place to put them in. Anyway, Senator Lynch, no, that, I appreciate that because I'm just reading that and my concern is that in terms of, as I was talking to Senator Warner, I said that if we're going to require that these gifts be approved by the Governor or the Legislature, before they're deemed accepted, that many times the donor may, I guess, get cold feet. A lot of times the gift is maybe a spur-of-the-moment thing. Maybe they...if it takes a while before the approval or the acceptance is allowed that it
