

CLERK: (Record vote read. See pages 1854-55 of the Legislative Journal.) 11 ayes, 24 nays on the amendment.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: The Beutler amendment fails. I raise the call.

CLERK: Senator Beutler would move to amend, Madam President. (FA170 appears on page 1855 of the Legislative Journal.)

PRESIDENT ROBAK: The Chair recognizes Senator Beutler.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Madam President and members of the Legislature, perhaps my prior amendment was too broadly drawn. This particular amendment would simply delete insecticides and fungicides from the definition of those items that are exempt, on the grounds that I argued previously. Thank you.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Thank you, Senator. Senator Dierks.

SENATOR DIERKS: Thank you, Madam President, and members of the body, Senator Beutler, have you circulated your amendment? Do we have a copy of that?

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Senator Beutler.

SENATOR DIERKS: Will you tell me what they are again?

SENATOR BEUTLER: (Microphone not activated)...and 11 of page 2.

SENATOR DIERKS: You're taking out what now?

SENATOR BEUTLER: Insecticides and fungicides.

SENATOR DIERKS: I would have some problems with that. If you wanted to include the word "pesticide", I would be willing to look at that. But when you remove that why...

SENATOR BEUTLER: Pesticides, Senator, I'm sorry, I'm not following.

SENATOR DIERKS: Well, when you take out insecticides and fungicides why I would like to have you substitute the word "pesticide".

SENATOR BEUTLER: Well, doesn't that have the same effect then
