SENATOR BEUTLER: Okay, and is it...

SPEAKER WITHEM: Time. Senator Jones.

SENATOR JONES: Question.

SPEAKER WITHEM: The question has been called. Do I see four hands in addition to Senator Jones? Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: I don't...I don't think there's been enough discussion. This is a different amendment and I'm asking that that calling of the question be ruled out of order.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Let me just check and see what the speakers have been. Senator Chambers, as I recall the rule, it basically says that the Speaker may rule the calling the question out of order if, in the Speaker's...presiding officer's opinion that there has not been sufficient debate based on the complexity of the issue. I think we've had six speakers on this issue. I think it's one I will allow the membership to make its determination as to whether the question should be called. So I will, provided...have I seen the four hands? I assume yours was not one of those. Your hand went up and I assume, Senator Chambers, yours was not one of those. I do see the hands. The question is, shall debate now cease? All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Record, Mr. Clerk.

ASSISTANT CLERK: 13 ayes, 9 nays to cease debate, Mr. President.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Debate is not ceased. Senator Will.

SENATOR WILL: Mr. Speaker, members of the body, I rise in support of the Beutler amendment. I commend Senator Beutler. I think he has analyzed this issue carefully and has brought to us some...some well-reasoned arguments for some of the changes that he would make to this bill and I again commend him for that. We have had, on the Revenue Committee, some interesting discussions over the last couple of years with respect to tax policy and
