

Exemptions for Animal Medications, and what I wanted to ask you, with respect to subcategories (a), (b), and (c) on lines 10, 12, and 15 of page 2, the three separate categories, this chart applies to (c), is that correct? I mean, as I read through this, it doesn't purport to...

SENATOR DIERKS: It would actually include...I think it would also include some of (a). We are talking about insecticides, fungicides, that would also be included in what you are asking for, I think, part of (a) on line 10.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Some of (a), you think, also.

SENATOR DIERKS: Quite possibly some of (b), we are talking about vitamins, minerals.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Okay, but, clearly, this chart doesn't...isn't nearly as broad as the three categories taken together in the bill, right?

SENATOR DIERKS: Well, that's true, but I can add to that a little bit, if you'd like,...

SENATOR BEUTLER: Sure.

SENATOR DIERKS: ...we have some of the states requirements here, Kansas and Iowa notably.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Do you have that in chart form? I would be interested in seeing that.

SENATOR DIERKS: It is not in chart form. It is in the form that comes from their Department of Revenue, the way they set up their taxes. If you'd like, I'll send it over to you and you can take a look, or I will...

SENATOR BEUTLER: Sure, I'd appreciate it.

SENATOR DIERKS: Okay.

SENATOR BEUTLER: With respect to the fiscal cost of the bill, the amount of the exemption, the total amount that was estimated, of that amount, was there an estimate...I assume the estimate was broken down between (a), (b), and (c), so that we have some idea of how much money each one of those is costing,
