SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay, let me read...okay. But any of these items can be used on an animal even if that animal is raised for show. And if it's an animal that ordinarily is eaten, but this particular one won't be, the exemption applies even to that animal?

SPEAKER WITHEM: Time.

SENATOR DIERKS: Well, of course, those animals are being used for food production whether in show or not.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Let me introduce Colleen and Richard Ingerle under the south balcony from Elba, guests of Senator Schimek. Senator Schimek's district extends into Elba, evidently, so we're very pleased to see them here with us. Senator Beutler, you are recognized to close.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Senator Withem, members of the Legislature, in discussing with a number of people the syntax of that particular sentence, I think that, in the end, the problem is with the word "and" and not with the word "storage", and so what we will do is try to take care of the word "and" on Select File and I'll withdraw the current amendment before us.

SPEAKER WITHEM: The amendment is withdrawn. Anything else on the bill, Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Beutler would move to amend, amendment number 6, Senator.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Senator Beutler.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Senator Withem, we've already discussed that particular item. I'll withdraw that amendment.

SPEAKER WITHEM: It is withdrawn.
