

CLERK: Madam President, I have the lobby report for this week to be inserted in the Journal. And your Committee on Enrollment and Review reports they have carefully examined engrossed...reengrossed LB 772. (See pages 1879 of the Legislative Journal.)

Madam President, with respect to LB 172, no E & R. I do have a motion to indefinitely postpone the bill, filed by Senator Chambers. Senator Wesely has the option to lay the bill over, Madam President.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Senator Wesely.

SENATOR WESELY: Yeah, I ask that it be laid over today.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Thank you, Senator Wesely. The bill is laid over. We turn then to LB 860.

CLERK: LB 860, Madam President, no E & R on 860. The first motion I have is by Senator Withem to indefinitely postpone the bill. Pull that. Yes, sir.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: It is withdrawn.

CLERK: The next amendment I have is by Senator Robinson. AM1576, Senator. You'll find...the members will find it in your bill books.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Chair recognizes Senator Robinson.

SENATOR ROBINSON: Madam President, members of the body, you've been handed out the amendment earlier. I'd just like to visit with you briefly about it. Following are the changes that are embodied in this amendment. I would like to briefly describe these changes. First, no change is made in the distribution of lottery funds. If you'll recall the designation of lottery funds was a concern of Senator Withem's. This amendment includes four options for funding Internet. Number one, you may use up to one-half of the ESU computing levy. Number two, using school district General Funds through a budget lid exception. Three, you can use the Education Innovating Fund for grants; and, four, you can use grants from the newly created School Technology Fund.
