

we've gone about this. Well, there was a bill heard in his committee that had to do with putting technology in the Weatherization Fund, so you can't say there wasn't a public hearing. And the Policy Review Committee, which is made up of Senator Hillman and Senator Hall, Senator Warner, Senator Withem and Senator Wehrbein, and I think all of you heard what Senator Warner said, he supports my amendment, they've reviewed the School Weatherization Fund. So I think that in itself tells you something very reliable right there, that this thing just hasn't been foisted on the Legislature. There's two groups that have looked at it, in fact the...Senator Beutler's committee voted it out six-zero, a couple people weren't there. We talk about continuing needs in weatherization and everything else. We also have continuing needs in education. folks. With the information highway upon us, we can't get involved too soon. And we're not doing it very fast if you take a good look around the state at what we've done with the money that we give to the educational service units. We must move more quickly than we have in the past. Senator Bohlke, could I have a question for you?

SENATOR CROSBY: Senator Bohlke, would you respond?

SENATOR ROBINSON: Do you have anything on the discussion on accountable receipts?

SENATOR BOHLKE: Senator Robinson, we have quite a bit of information on accountable receipts. Do we have a definite answer? Perhaps not. We think the answer is it is not counted as an accountable receipt.

SENATOR ROBINSON: An accountable receipt.

SENATOR BOHLKE: We're determining if that is absolutely true.

SENATOR ROBINSON: Okay.

SENATOR BOHLKE: But the indication is now that it is not treated as an accountable receipt, just as the lottery funds are not treated as an accountable receipt.

SENATOR ROBINSON: I appreciate that answer because Senator Wickersham is casting doubt on my amendment because of that one area. Thank you very much.

SENATOR CROSBY: Thank you, Senator Robinson. Before continuing
