SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: Thank you, Mr. Clerk. Senator Beutler, which division would you like to bring up?

SENATOR BEUTLER: Oh, I guess the sunset provision.

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: Section 2, we will begin discussion on the first division of the Beutler amendment, which is Section 2, and for the body, we've divided it two ways, two sections. Section 2 is by itself; Sections 1 and 3 will be together. We are on Section 2 at this point, and the Chair will recognize Senator Wesely, who is the next person on the list on this particular amendment if you wish to discuss this division.

SENATOR WESELY: Which amendment is before us now, I am sorry?

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: Mr. Clerk, the amendment number.

CLERK: You are on the sunset provision, I think, Senator.

SENATOR WESELY: Oh, the sunset. Well, I don't...why don't I defer...can I ask Senator Beutler, can you describe the amendment again before I go on further, the one before us?

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: Senator Beutler, Senator Wesely yielded some of his time to you to describe the Section 2.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Senator Bernard-Stevens, I believe I should have some time on my own to introduce the amendment.

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: Well, the Chair is ruling that actually the amendment was introduced. You did introduce the amendment and it was divided, so I'm going on this portion that the amendment has been introduced, and you can now explain on Senator Wesely's time what Section 2 would do, if you so desire.
