

think that's also a valid concern even if it does ultimately have to be funded out of property taxes. We may decide in this body, after debate later this year, next year, that we will provide significant additional funding to schools so that they can reduce their reliance on property taxes. And at that point we could very well take care of any residual problems we would have created by making the Internet support program a loan program as opposed to a grant program. Again, I don't expect Internet to be a static program, I don't think that any of you would, if you've been following the rapid changes in technology. We will need a loan program to give us the ability to keep pace with those changes.

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: Thank you, Senator Wickersham. There being no further lights, Senator Beutler, to close.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Senator Bernard-Stevens, members of the Legislature, there's no point to discussing this any longer. I'm sure you all have feelings as to whether a loan program or a grant program is better. And if you vote for the amendment you're voting for a loan program instead of a grant program. Thank you.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: You've heard the closing. The question is, shall Section 1 of the divided amendment, 1867, be agreed to? All those in favor vote aye; all those opposed vote nay. Have you all voted?

SENATOR BEUTLER: Call of the house, roll call vote in...in...

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: Senator Witek, if you don't mind, we'll do it that way.

SENATOR BEUTLER: ...in...beginning with the A's.

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: The question is, shall the house go under call? All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Record, Mr. Clerk.

ASSISTANT CLERK: 17 ayes, 0 nays to go under call.
