SENATOR DAY: It can be either. If they are, you know, \$10,000 in arrears and there's no way they can make that up, then if they'll just set up a payment plan to pay, it means sometimes it was to pay, you know, no more than \$10 a month if that's all they were able to pay, they do set up a payment plan.

When would I be informed that my license would be taken away and when would there be an appeals process, any hearing on that or simply done?

SENATOR DAY: Senator Bernard-Stevens, I just went through the appeals process.

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: Well I apologize, I was talking to someone else on the phone.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: One minute.

SENATOR DAY: You'd be notified when you're three months in arrears, there would be an administrative hearing where you could say there is a mistake in fact, I have in fact paid it. If you could prove that it would be dropped. If you're still not happy you can appeal to the district court and during none of that time is your license revoked. As long as you are working through the system you still would have your license. It would only be with a final decision that your license would be revoked.

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: And when that license would be revoked, let's assume that I had a legitimate reason for not paying, maybe visitation rights have not been granted, whatever the reasons may be, and I felt I had a legitimate claim on that, what would happen on that? I would have the right to go to court to have the mediation, whatever the case may be, but my license would still be revoked?

SENATOR DAY: As long as you're in the court process your license would not be revoked. As long as you were appealing the license would not be revoked.

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: So if I said, okay, I'll pay \$2 a
