

said she doesn't want to, all she has to do is not drive and meet him halfway and the driver's license would be revoked and her problem would be solved. Now I doubt that she would do that, but as we get into these, this seems to be the issues that cause the greatest debate and certainly not the idea that people should be on time with their child support payments. Certainly how the bill outlines it, it gives ample opportunity for additional hearings, an additional opportunity to go to court to prove the point as to why they may or may not be late. The argument I heard on the first day why we shouldn't do this was that professional licenses were expensive. Well you know raising children without child support is also expensive and so I think that we do have two different debates going on here, but I think certainly as far as recognizing the need for children to have those child support payments on time and obviously if there is a three-month span and all the considerations in the bill for someone to go forward and explain what circumstances may or may not be the reason for being late seems to me to be some of the necessary safeguards. I would suggest that we need to come back in another session and discuss some of the very real problems with visitation rights and the problems that I think, the very real problems that I think noncustodial parents have a very good point. And I think that, I hope that we will come back next session with some legislation that discusses some of those and revisions to make sure that those noncustodial parents rights are protected as far as areas of visitation. Thank you.
