

stuck on a list that was published in general circulation of people who didn't owe child support, but those errors did occur. And that it is done just simply to make the point that errors can occur through no fault of the person whose name appears in a newspaper of general circulation, or whose name appears on a list of licenses to be revoked. And so because of that, I want to make clear that if there is any liability that it is not going to be on the licensing authority. If we tell DMV you must revoke the license, if we tell the State Board of Health Examiners, you must revoke the license, if we tell the State Bar Association, go revoke the license, whatever, that they don't have any liability. The amendment is AM1900, it should be on your desk, and that is what the amendment does. I would urge adoption of the amendment.

SENATOR BEUTLER: It says the director, the county attorney, or authorized attorney who provides certification to the individual licensing agency shall be liable for any loss or damage resulting...
