

two years delinquent on our child support screen, and it came to his attention.

SPEAKER WITHEM: One minute.

SENATOR LINDSAY: Of course, he has a tremendous, he had about 16, 17 thousand dollar delinquency for those two years and, of course, she immediately came in and receipted for that and satisfied the entire amount because he didn't want his credit jeopardized, by any means. There are problems, this is Douglas County. We have shown you what is happening in Lancaster County. Those are computerized systems. Those are computerized systems. Now in your systems in some of your smaller counties that aren't computerized, I suspect there may be errors there also. And all...the point that I am trying to make now is that if we are going to be taking these away when nobody did anything wrong, who has to pay for that? I think we have got to address that, and we will address that. We will address that. If we vote against this amendment, we are saying that the person who had that license taken should pay for it, and that's...I mean somebody has to, and that's just a question, again, it is not one I...

SPEAKER WITHEM: Time. Senator Day, on the Lindsay amendment.

SENATOR DAY: Thank you, Mr. Speaker and colleagues. I understand, I believe, what Senator Lindsay is trying to do with this amendment, and I really don't have a problem with what he is trying to do, but I don't...I believe, as Senator Bromm talked, this one is too wide a brush and will not accomplish what he...what we...what I think might be necessary, and I would be more than willing to work on some language, and would hope that Senator Bromm would help too. I think it is important that we realize what we are doing here. We refer to names being printed in the paper, and things like that. We have put due process into this legislation. I am not going to tell you a mistake could never be made, but I am going to tell you it is not going to be made easily. First of all, letters will go out to all the ADC cases, and the IV-D, I should say, cases telling them about this law, where there is child support. Then they will start with the delinquent. They must be three months delinquent. They will get another certified letter saying our records show you three months delinquent. Now at that time they have the opportunity to come in and say this isn't right, I am not three months delinquent. And then we... that it can be
