

Senator Beutler has asked for a roll call vote. Senator Abboud, would you like to record. Senator Avery. Senator Chambers, would you like to check in. Senator Schrock, would you like to check in. Senator Will. Senator Landis, would you like to check in. Senator Schellpeper. Senator Schellpeper, the house is under call. Everyone has returned now and Senator Beutler did ask for a roll call vote. We are voting on whether or not LB 106 should be indefinitely postponed. Mr. Clerk, please call the roll.

ASSISTANT CLERK: (Roll call vote taken. See page 1920 of the Legislative Journal.) The vote is 13 ayes, 27 nays.

SENATOR CROSBY: The motion fails. I will raise the call. Mr. Clerk.

ASSISTANT CLERK: Madam President, I have nothing further on the bill.

SENATOR CROSBY: We are back to LB 106. For discussion on the bill itself, Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Madam President, members of the Legislature, I have an amendment which is coming up there, and I want to have Senator Dierks look at something with me, if he will, because this is what my amendment is going to deal with. It's on page 2 of the green copy. It's in lines 15 and 16 where we are defining veterinary medicines. Now the way that it stands this is what the language says, veterinary medicines shall include medicines for the prevention or treatment of disease or injury. Now it does not say prevention or treatment of disease or injury to animals, so any medicine, any medicine, that would mean medicine that would prevent an illness or injury to a human being also, the way the definition reads, wouldn't it, based on the way the definition reads?

SENATOR DIERKS: Well, I suspect you're right. I don't see a difference there.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Well, let me ask you this, would you be a...and then I have another part of the definition. Where it says, veterinary medicines shall include, I'll wait until you get through.

SENATOR DIERKS: I beg your pardon?
