

never be necessary to define a word in statute and say for purposes of this section unless the context otherwise indicates. It means you are giving a word a definition that it ordinarily does not have. If everybody is satisfied that what is said in Section 1, the narrative, the language above, we don't need to define agricultural chemicals, we don't need to define feed, we don't need to define veterinary medicines. I'd like to ask Senator Dierks a question.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Senator Dierks.

SENATOR DIERKS: Sure.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Dierks, would you be in favor then of just striking all these definitions and let these words mean what they mean in the dictionary?

SENATOR DIERKS: I don't believe so, Senator Chambers. I guess what I'd like to do is offer you the opportunity to work with you for an amendment on Select File and not take the body's time up with the issue. If you agree to do that, why I'd be willing to work with you a little bit on that.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Well see, you're the kind of man who whether I agreed at this point or not and whatever happened here today you'd still work with me because you're that kind of guy and so am I. We battle here when the lines are drawn and we're in a combat zone and then after we leave the combat zone we go someplace and negotiate to see if we should have an armistice or if we can reach a true peace agreement. And the thing that would be a peace agreement with me is to kill this bill. But if it's not going to die, and you've made it clear you would not support the killing of it, then I'd like to see the definitions be as precise as they can be. And if the words are designed to mean something other than what I'm saying my understanding of these words is, I want to be told that. If veterinary medicine means medicines or substances used for a purpose other than treating animals, I want to be told that. And if that's the only thing that veterinary medicines can mean, there's no need to define the word. It can't...we can't have it both ways. Either it means only one thing and it can't mean anything else, and if that's the case we don't need a definition.
