

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Right.

SPEAKER WITHEM: And, Senator Dierks, again for my edification, what is the policy rationale as to why that is not a change to your bill that should be adopted?

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Senator Dierks.

SENATOR DIERKS: I'm not sure what the policy rationale is, Senator Withem. I just think that the language is sufficient the way it is put together. It was...I don't have any problem with the drafting of the bill. I think it was done well and I don't believe that we need to make those many changes. I told Senator Chambers I'd offer to visit with him and try to work something out for Select File, and I will do that, and I think he knows that I will do that and I think the rest of the body does too and I am willing to....

SPEAKER WITHEM: So it's just a matter of you like your bill the way it is and you're not accepting any changes to it, is that where we are now at this point?

SENATOR DIERKS: Well, I haven't seen a change I like yet.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Okay. I guess I'm just confused that this is the sort of change that appears to add to the clarity of the bill and I think I'll leave...I was going to pull this motion after this, but I don't think that was a very good explanation. I think I'm going to leave the motion up there for some discussion if anybody would care to discuss it.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Thank you, Senator Withem. Senator Warner.

SENATOR WARNER: Madam President, I'll speak again. My principle objection is adding the word "to animals" again is for clarity reasons. The definition is very clear in the Section 1, lines 1 through 8 to limit it to what is traditionally has been identified as animal life that ordinarily constitutes food for human consumption. I'm not sure whether adding animals down there without that definition that's already very, very plain at the top, conceivably could expand the definition rather than narrow it. I did comment earlier that whether the word "means" or includes is kind of immaterial to me. On that one I would object to striking shall include in some of the other sections,
