SENATOR LANDIS: That's not similar, that's exactly what reinsurance is like.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Oh, I understand it. I'm going to support your bill. Thank you.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Thank you, Senator Chambers. Senator Landis, there are no other lights on, would you please close, or waive close, or maybe do something. There, that's good, Senator Landis. Thank you. Senator Landis, does, in fact, waive closing. Closing has been waived. The question now then is the advancement of LB 616. All in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. Record.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the advancement of 616.

SPEAKER WITHEM: LB 616 is advanced. LB 696.
