Why do we have to be the victims of a bureaucracy that simply doesn't want to be creative, that doesn't want to exercise the kinds of alternatives that they could exercise? I look forward to the debate next year on Senator Kristensen's three by three tab that...well, I shouldn't say Senator Kristensen's, the Department of Motor Vehicles three by three tab which is going to be a uniform blahness for everybody. I just can't imagine a worse system and I can't imagine, after it's been demonstrated in Florida and other places, why we cannot do better. Thank you.
