LB 696, 712

SENATOR BRASHEAR: Madam President, members of the body, thank you, Senator Robinson, very much. I have never cared, in response to Senator Robinson's comment, I have been willing to have this money go anywhere anybody wanted it to go, divided any way it was to be divided.
