

SPEAKER WITHEM: I would point out.... Thank you, Senator Hall. I would point to the members we are under call. Members should be in their seats. Record your presence, please. Senator Janssen and Senator Avery are both here and they need to record their presence. Mr. Clerk, who else are we looking for? Senator Lindsay, Senator Kristensen and Senator Robak, please return to the floor. Senator Lindsay, Senator Kristensen, Senator Robak. Waiting for Senator Robak.
