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amendment.

SENATOR AVERY: Madam Speaker, Senator Wehrbein, would you maybe answer a question I had?

SENATOR CROSBY: Senator Wehrbein.

SENATOR AVERY: In terms of vacancy savings, I know many of the larger departments, because of the number of employees, generally have vacancy savings in terms of the dollars that...and the employees, the turnover in many of the agencies is kind of quite high. Does...did the committee restore most of the vacancy savings and what committees did they...? You may have to wait and find what you...

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: I...I have that. I'm just looking for it. Just a second.

SENATOR AVERY: I think it's important that, as a body, we...we look at the spending here and I'm sure, being on Appropriations last time, that many agencies that do have vacancy savings can offer that agency some relief in terms of making up, and I can see the difference there when you have an agency and you don't fully fund the employees, they can make that salary up in terms of the vacancy savings. Would you...?

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Yes, most of our vacancy savings were restored...were not taken in University of Nebraska again, Social Services and Corrections.

SENATOR AVERY: In terms of the university, what was the total? Do you have a total on the vacancy savings...

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: A...I would have to look.

SENATOR AVERY: ...that was restored?

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: I would have... Just a second.

SENATOR AVERY: I can get that from you, I think, a little bit later.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Yeah, I don't have that to pop out at me. Between those four that I just mentioned it amounts to 15 million dollars.
