

SENATOR WESELY: All right. Thank you.

SENATOR CROSBY: Thank you, Senator Wesely. Any further discussion on LB 390? Seeing none, Senator Wehrbein, did you like to close on the bill?

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: I will waive closing. I just urge advancement of the bill.

SENATOR CROSBY: He waives closing. The question is the advancement to E & R Initial, LB 390. All in favor vote aye, opposed no. Record, please.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 0 nays, Madam President, on the advancement of LB 390.

SENATOR CROSBY: The bill advances. Before we continue with the next bill, Senator Robak has, as her guest today, and she's under the south balcony, Dee Kucera from Columbus. Would you please stand and be welcomed by your Legislature. Thank you for being here. We'll continue with LB 391. Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Madam President, 391, introduced by the Speaker at the request of the Governor. (Read title.) The bill was introduced on January 12 of this year, at that time referred to the Appropriations Committee. The bill was advanced to General File. There are committee amendments pending, Madam President.

SENATOR CROSBY: Senator Wehrbein, on the committee amendments.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Yes, Senator Crosby and members of the body. I handed out a sheet that says LB 391 across it, new...is construction, that refers to this. It's a summary of what starts on 153 in your book and continues through, oh, 100 and...quite a ways. That's the whole...that's the details of all of the construction, 153 up through 175, approximately, yeah 175. This sheet that I handed out should be on your desk. I wrote LB 391 across the top, that is a summary of this construction budget. I will just simply call your attention to the fact that we have, in the General Fund construction budget, a new Norfolk veterans home, that...the total amount of that is \$5.7 million. That is to get us on a list for new construction of veterans homes in Washington, D.C., actually to make the first list. We're on the second list. In order to move to the
