So I just wanted to take a couple minutes, Madam President, to go through some of what the chairman of the committee has already addressed but just thought I would review some of the significant changes in General Fund appropriations and indicate where the large dollar items are and that those increases, in my mind and in the mind of the majority of the Appropriations Committee, are certainly appropriate. Thank you.

SENATOR CROSBY: Thank you, Senator Maurstad. Senator Wesely.

SENATOR WESELY: Question.

SENATOR CROSBY: Senator Wesely has called the question. Do I see five hands? I see five hands. The question is, shall debate cease? All in favor vote aye, opposed no. We're voting on whether to cease debate. Have you all voted? Senator Wesely.

Senator Avery, would you like to record. Senator Abboud, would you like to check in. Senator Hillman, would you like to check in. Senator Stuhr, would you like to record. You will accept call-ins? We are voting on whether to cease debate and Senator Wesely said he will accept call-in votes.

ASSISTANT CLERK: Senator Hartnett voting yes. Senator Bernard-Stevens voting yes. Senator Warner voting yes. Senator Lynch voting yes. Senator Schrock voting yes. Senator Fisher voting no. Senator Brashear voting yes.
