

that there would be a change in that...in that program 107's budget, and, obviously, if the bill didn't pass, that what you have would remain. Because if I remember correctly, Senator Robinson's bill now takes that weatherization fund. So and I'm just wondering if we may want to develop between now and Select File a reference to that bill on what may happen?

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: I'm not clear. I'm not sure I understand what you're saying. And, Senator Robinson, you may want to get into this discussion. As I understand the weatherization fund, there's no new money coming into the weatherization fund and so what is coming in now will be loan repayments. And I understand Senator Robinson's bill to take that money that's coming back in as loan money and going to school, the Internet. This bill, by the way, this amendment to his amendment or his amendment, came up after we had done the budget.

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: No, I understand that, that's why I'm saying it might be something for us to look at on Select File. I'm unclear too how that may go. So I just wanted to point that out that...and I know Mike's listening with the fiscal staff, but if they could at least look at that between now and Select, and there may not have to be any changes made, but there may be something we may want to do. And I wanted to...I didn't want that to slip by on the discussion. On page 56, Roger, on the Department of Education I have a more philosophical thing to do. One of the things that the Department of Education was talking about two years and I know strongly this year, and I know that the department felt very comfortable with the committee and I know the committee felt, I think felt very comfortable working with the new Director-Commissioner Doug Christensen, but they have done a lot of things on the reorganizing of the departments and they've been trying to...they did have a lot of vacancy savings that they wanted to use to continue that reorganization effort. And one of their concerns was if, in fact, those monies were taken from them, it would be a disincentive for other agencies to go through a reorganization process because if they saved money to try to do things better in the upcoming years and they know it's going to be taken away, the incentive will be not to do that or to somehow hide the dollars. How did the Appropriations Committee deal with that? And do you think there's...do you think the department, even though much of the agency savings, the vacancy savings were taken, what...was there enough dollars carried over that you feel that the reorganization process is still going to be able to continue on
