

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: It is a...it to cover a deficit and add to the 500,000 dollar level.

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: Okay. Roger, now I am going to Agency 46, page 101 on the blue book, and I should know this but I don't, and I haven't had time to check with the Fiscal staff. On the General Funds, for one more year for continued operation of the Office of Juvenile Services, and there is \$383,000 for '95-96 only. I will give you a minute to find that.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: It's...

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: Why the one year only, and I guess my second question is, what happens the second year of the biennial budget, and it is just...I know there is something I should remember but I am not.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Well, it was anticipated that minimally there would be federal contributions available for the 1995-96 year, or at least by that time, to cover the cost of that with federal funds.

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: Would it be...would it be an alternative that could be explored between now and Select that we put in 383,000 for the second year with the intent language that that...those dollars would not be...

SENATOR CROSBY: One minute.

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: ...would not be there if there were, in fact, federal dollars for it? I mean I would feel more comfortable if I knew the dollars were going to be there for the agency, and then they are going to be...they would go back, revert back to the General Fund, if the federal funds, in fact, were there for it, but I am not convinced yet that any of those federal dollars are actually going to come through, and I am a little nervous on that.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Well, it is something we can look at. I, you know I don't know whether they will or won't be. There is several of these question marks as we have gone through the availability of federal funds. Whether we need to do it now, or whether we can wait until next January when we are back in session to see, I don't know. I am willing to look at that at this point and see.
