SENATOR CROSBY: Thank you, Senator Fisher. Any discussion on LB 459? Seeing none, Senator Fisher, do you want to close? He waives closing. The question is, shall LB 459 advance to E & R initial? All in favor vote aye, opposed no. Record, please.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays, Madam President, on the advancement of 459.

SENATOR CROSBY: The bill advances. LB 732.

CLERK: 732, a bill introduced by Senator Cudaback. (Read title.) The bill was introduced on January 19, referred to the Revenue Committee, advanced to General File. I have no amendments to the bill, Madam President.

SENATOR CROSBY: Thank you. Senator Cudaback.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Madam President, members, LB 732 simply corrects a wrong that was made a year ago. I introduced a bill that changed the way we distribute in lieu of tax payments. 732 will take it back the way it was originally and that is based on mill levies rather than requirements. The Constitution spells that exactly how these dollars must be distributed in lieu of tax payments and it says mill levies, so I'm putting it back the way the Constitution says, and that's what the bill does.

SENATOR CROSBY: Thank you, Senator Cudaback. Discussion on 732. Senator Warner.

SENATOR WARNER: Madam President, just briefly, to concur that this is a bill that makes the statute consistent with the Constitution, makes no change in distribution from what the Constitution requires. They've always been doing it under the Constitution and it's probably well that the language of the statute and the Constitution is the same, so I'd support the bill.

SENATOR CROSBY: Thank you, Senator Warner. Any further discussion on the bill? Seeing none, Senator Cudaback.
