

not pass and this \$4 million is not put in place, then of course I would hope, and I'll look around again so I can remember who is listening and who isn't, so I can remind you all, so I can remind you, some of you, I don't mean that, so I can remind you that if you had listened at the time you had the chance to understand the difference, maybe we could avoid a lot more unnecessary, unnecessary, unnecessary conversation. I don't have a list, but I'd want to say unnecessary conversation on the floor about some of these bills. It's hard to support the trailer bill, you know, to be completely frank. I think Floyd and LaVon and I and some of the members know that. We put it out there because we know these were important things that we had to discuss. We should try to fund if we can as it involves libraries and 309 and the rest because you should have the opportunity on the floor to understand what we know and what was notable to be included in the budget and that's the reason for a trailer bill. In the past it could have been used for a lot of things, storing money, I don't know for sure about that, but in any case, but in any case it was something that you had to know about and it would include items that you probably should be reminded of and you may have had a priority of two in their yourself. As it applies to 309 though I want to remind you again, you got a chance to get a handle on how we do this, not only in the immediate future, but in the future in the long run to administer space, develop a fund with a depreciation factor administered by the people in DAS through the Building Division so that we can do things the way we should have been doing and now we have to do, we have to begin to do because the circumstances just cannot deteriorate any more than they have already. So with that do what you will with the trailer bill, it's going to be hard obviously to pass and I appreciate the chance again to talk about 309. Thanks.
