SENATOR CROSBY: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...and that is civilized? I think that is barbaric! I think it is atrocious! And I think any society which allows it is not civilized. If everybody on this floor is a huntsman I still mean every word that I say. And I think there has to be a streak of cowardice in a person who goes out and hunts these animals. If you're seeking food it's different, we're talking about strictly and purely for pleasure and for business purposes, when these companies bring these suckers from wherever they come and tell them, we got some birds out here that even somebody like you and go out here and blow away and you'll feel good, then you'll buy my product or maybe make a deal with me. How contemptible! How despicable and how totally out of line with that Bible you all believe which makes you stewards over all...

SENATOR CROSBY: Time.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...all the earth. Is this what God had in mind? Did you say I have a minute left or did you say...

SENATOR CROSBY: I said, time.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Oh, okay.

SENATOR CROSBY: Thank you, Senator Chambers. Senator Maurstad.

SENATOR MAURSTAD: I'd like to call the question, Madam President.

SENATOR CROSBY: The question has been called. Do I see five hands? I do see five hands. The question is, shall debate cease? All in favor vote aye, opposed no. There's a request for a call of the house. All in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. Record, please.
