

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Madam President, members of the Legislature, I'm going to support Senator Preister's amendment. Are there any other lights on, on this amendment?

SENATOR CROSBY: Well, there are four lights on.

SENATOR BROMM: Thank you, Madam President. And, Senator Preister, would you yield to a question or two, please.

SENATOR CROSBY: Senator Preister.

SENATOR PREISTER: Honorable President, friends all, yes, Senator Bromm, I would certainly yield.

SENATOR BROMM: Senator Preister, in your looking at this issue, I know I haven't got the statute in front of me. But somewhere in the statutes there is a requirement that an issuing of permit on an application...that the Game and Parks is supposed to determine that it's in the public interest to issue such a permit. Is that...did you find that or...

SENATOR PREISTER: Yes, Senator Bromm, that is my understanding that that's part of their review process.

SENATOR BROMM: And have you had an opportunity to inquire as to what they look into or take into consideration when they try to determine whether it's in the public interest to issue such a permit?

SENATOR PREISTER: Senator Bromm, I need to speak more directly more directly with people from the Game and Parks because I really haven't had that opportunity to get a full description of how and what they do with that.

SENATOR BROMM: Okay. I have received a copy of their regulations pertaining to controlled shooting areas. Have you received those regulations at this point?
