SENATOR CHAMBERS: But whether or not it's illegal to possess it, if a person came to one of these areas would... would he be allowed to use it if he brought it with him, or do they provide the weaponry when you go there?

SENATOR AVERY: Some provide. I do not believe the individuals would allow them to use those type of weapons.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: All right. Is there anything in the law that prevents one of these shooting areas, if we have the minimum amount of territory, and we discussed that, what that would be, from being totally enclosed, all four sides and across the top? There's nothing that would prohibit that, is there?

SENATOR AVERY: Not to my knowledge.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Oh, Senator Schrock is saying that there is. Let me ask him a question if he would...
