SENATOR CHAMBERS: Now when one of these areas is selected, is it selected because of the habitat, and by that I meant everything that is growing on the land or a part of the land, or is it selected because of its proximity to the plant or headquarters or some part of the operation of the corporation that is going to establish it?

SENATOR AVERY: I don't think it's selected on... on any. It's where the individual may have purchased some land. I don't think there's a selection process because you can... you can plant what vegetation, you can create the habitat, develop the habitat of an area, so...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: So with reference to the one that you inspected, what kind of foliage, by that I meant trees, bushes, whatever, did you see at that location?

SENATOR AVERY: There was a large areas of native grass. There's areas, as I was told, that they plant crops to harvest and in between the crops they plant grassy areas...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Were there any trees?

SENATOR AVERY: ..to make a diverse.... Yes, there are trees in the area, shrubs. I guess I saw that gamut of what would be considered like a wildlife area that the state would manage.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Would a person who ordinarily wouldn't be able to shoot straight enough or quickly enough to hit one of these animals in the wild...

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ..be more likely to be able to hit one in this controlled area?

SENATOR AVERY: I don't think so.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Are these animals, these birds, raised under these conditions, fed by human beings? Are they fed by human beings?

SENATOR AVERY: Yes.
