CLERK: 25 ayes, 1 nay on the advancement of 646A.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: LB 646A advances. Senator Matzke would like to announce that he has several very special guests visiting today. CLERK: Madam President, 658 on Select File has been discussed at that stage of the proceedings. Enrollment and Review amendments have been adopted as have amendment by Senator Pedersen.
