We're talking about being cruel and heartless to women who are trying to bring a pregnancy to term, and by definition they are impoverished and need the assistance. If you multiply three times...

PRESIDENT ROBAK: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...71, it would be \$71 each of the last three months of her pregnancy, and that is too much for this state to offer in assistance to these women who are trying to carry a pregnancy to term? I don't think that it is. In fact, I think that is too small an amount. But I'm not doing anything with the amount of money, I'm doing something only with the amount of time that the money would be available. My amendment would strike Senator Pirsch's two months and say that this assistance would be available from the point that conception is medically determined. Madam President, I will ask for a call of the house and then I will take a machine vote, but I want it to be a record vote.
